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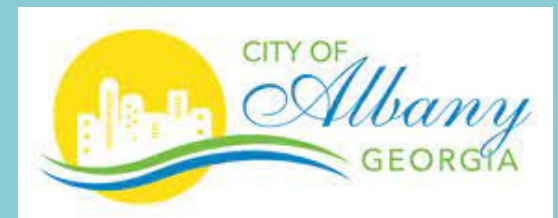
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## RESPONDING ENGAGING AND CULTIVATING HOPE





## PURPOSE

- Reduce Mental Health calls to 911 system
- Reduce recidivism
- Connect individuals to resources
- Provide follow ups after crisis
- Advocacy
- Pair Law Enforcement with Mental Health professionals

## CO-RESPONSE PROCESS

Officers respond to dispatch of 911 call  
REACH will be dispatched to scenes deemed safe  
De-Escalation of crisis  
Linkage to community resources and services  
Follow-up to ensure individuals get the services they need

### SERVICES PROVIDED

Brief Crisis Assessment  
Suicide Risk Assessment  
Peer Support Services  
Coordination of Care and linkage to resources

### POPULATION SERVED

Services are available for adults 18 and older in Dougherty County

### ACCESSING SERVICES

Individuals who access the 911 call center or who contact Albany Police Department with whom it has been determined that there is a mental health or addictive disease concern may access the Co-response team

### STAFFING

The Co-Response team will consist of  
Officer from Albany Police Department  
Fully Licensed Clinician  
Certified Peer Specialist
